



DocLink Fixes “broken” Inter-Document Hyperlinks for Submissions Stored in CARA



Import submissions

No changes required to document content or hyperlinks



View source document from CARA

File-system path hyperlinks are automatically converted to CARA URLs to the target document in the repository



Click on the link

The hyperlink correctly opens the target document for viewing from the CARA repository

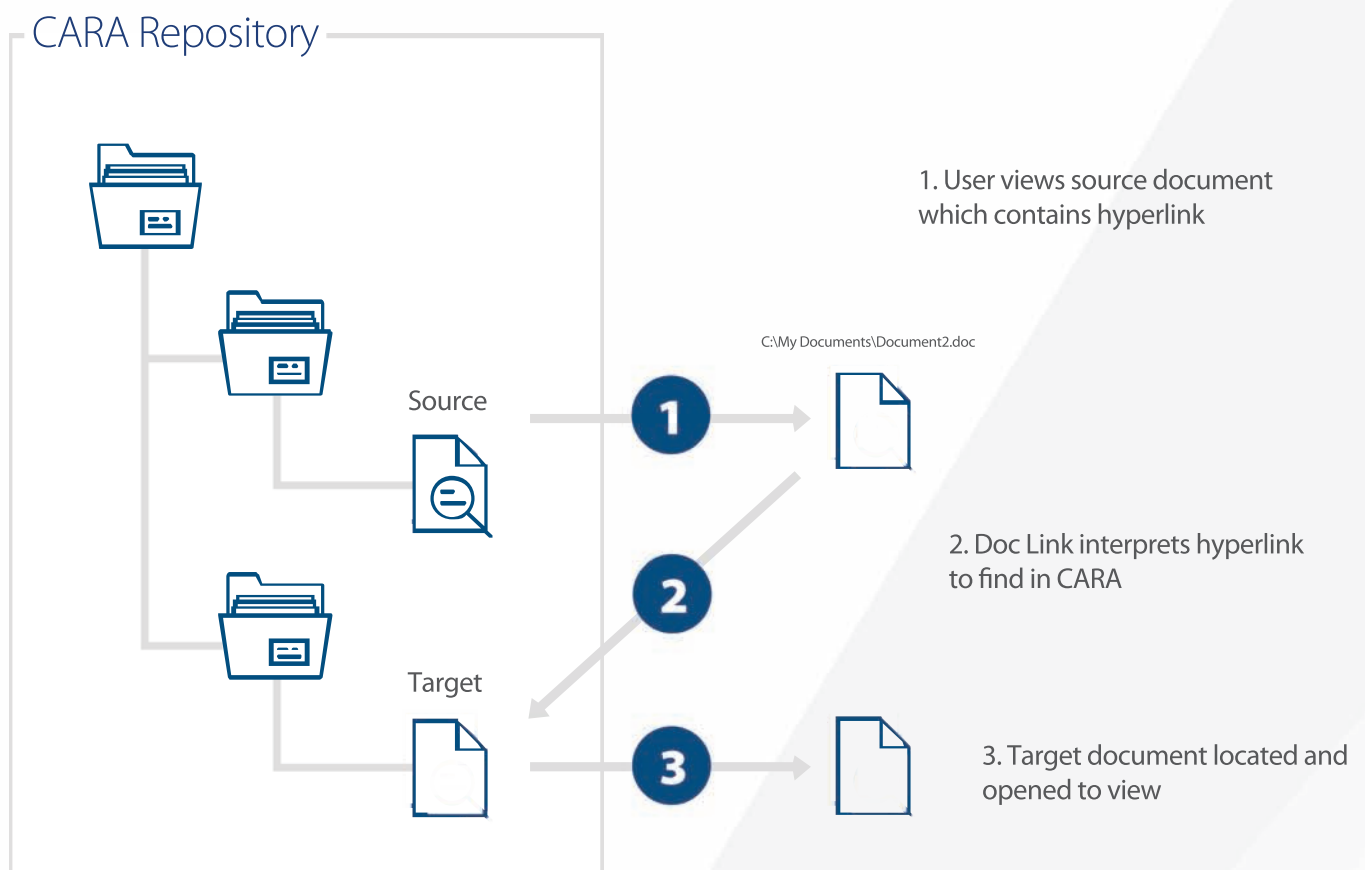


Export submissions

No changes required to document content or hyperlinks, MD5 checksum is therefore unaffected

Inter-document Hyperlinks

Submission documents may contain hyperlinks (cross-references) to other documents, the targets of which are determined according to a folder path on a file system, relative to the location of the source document. This is essential for submission to regulatory authorities. Many companies store their submissions in CARA. In order to make these hyperlinks “live” they need to be converted from file system links e.g. C:\Folder\Document.doc, to a link with CARA path information.



How it works

- When viewing a PDF, DocLink scans for filesystem path hyperlinks and changes them to CARA links.
- Source document retains the filesystem path document, allowing export to send to regulatory authorities.
- Link is changed only in the temporary viewed PDF, not in the source document, so MD5 checksums not affected.
- Can be integrated with DocSecure (watermarking and eSignature manifestation tool).
